Police Will Sift Records On Patients

Conference Held On Boy's Death

By BILL CALLAHAN Buffalo police yesterday approved a suggestion of medical and scientific authorities to check thoroughly records of institutions caring for mental patients in the search for the killer of little Andrew T. Ashley.

Nearly 30 members of the Police Department and physi-clans met for two hours in the Police Academy to discuss all aspects of the vicious slaying of the North Buffalo youngster.

They agreed that a more intensive investigation of pa-tients' records in mental hospitals, institutions, nursing homes and rest homes is necessary. The experts also advocated a close check of mental patients released by institutions to serve as domestics in homes, particularly those in the north Buffalo section.
